Commissioner Chasteen requested discussion on a new business located on road 120 in district
He is concerned about the influx of traffic since the business will employ 40-60 people. Since there is a no zoning resolution in the County, District Attorney Kenny Wright said there is really nothing we can do about it.

14. Discussion on the recycling center operation and how to maintain this service to the County was met with different views by the Board. Commissioner Furnas is passionate about continuing this service to the County. Commissioner Chasteen is concerned about the maintenance problems attached to this service.

15. Discussion for continued live broadcasting for the BOCC meeting: Commissioner Chasteen submitted a quote from Monitor Technology in the amount of \$13,887.57 for main room conference equipment and setup, and another quote in the amount of \$3,438.74 for hallway equipment to view live stream for a total of \$17,326.31. The County now pays \$15.00 a month to zoom to the public.

16. Commissioner Chasteen would like for the County website to have a list of names to view for those that have been laid to rest in the County Cemetery. District Attorney Kenny Wright will need to verify if this would be legal, or an invasion of privacy.

17. The "Cares Act Money" was discussed as to the allocation of these funds. The monies are now being held in the general fund.

18. Chasteen discussed with the Board on being able to enforce all employees and officials that are able to purchase and receive items, goods, and services on behalf of Ottawa County to attend classes instructed by OSU. No action was taken because each elected official has the authority to send/zoom employees to classes they feel are necessary. This is not a Board decision.

25. Commissioner's activity reports: District 1: Commissioner Furnas appreciates all of the work his crew performs on a daily basis. He asks that the public to please call his barn to report any problems with roads in his district. District 2: Commissioner Chasteen is executing a program as to how road

maintenance will be handled. Routine maintenance. District 3: Commissioner Earls has been helping the Sheriff by welding doors at the jail. Routine maintenance. Earls also mention his concerns for safety at intersections. We have a shouldering machine to help make them safer and offered it for use to District's 1 and 2.
