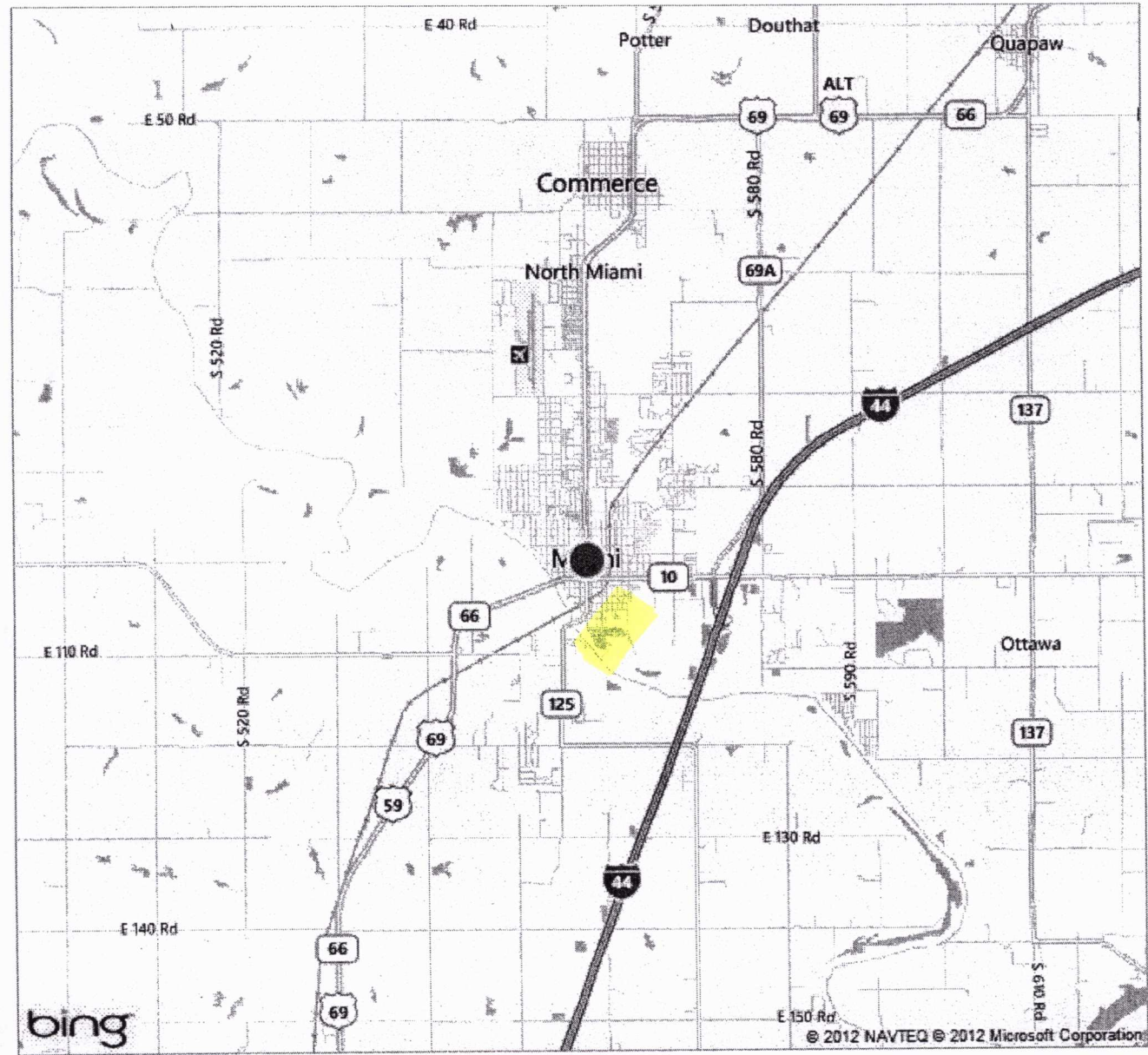

E. Project Budget:

Costs include the following estimated expenses: Electrical \$10,000; Plumbing \$30,000 (existing lines are not reusable; Kitchen \$15,000; Wall Partition \$2,500; Framing/Carpentry/Demolition \$2,500; and incidentals.

G. Brief explanation of local effort in project:

The Boys & Girls Club of Ottawa County Board of Director's is working with the City of Miami to secure a lease for the Armory building. The club is moving to the Armory because we have outgrown our current facility. The Board is seeking funding from this REAP grant as well as requesting funds from the local Tribal organizations. The club can hold 175 which include members and staff right now but once the club is in the Armory then the capacity will increase to 300 including members and staff. The Board of Directors have talked with local electricians, plumbers, etc. to get a budget to renovate the building to fit our needs.

H. Brief description of the project:

The Boys & Girls Club of Ottawa County is outgrowing our current facility. We can serve 125 right now but that leaves several youth on a waiting list every summer. In the Armory we would be able to serve 275 youth during the summer so that we don't have a waiting list. The funding we are requesting is to renovate the Armory for this purpose. The building we are currently in does not allow us to break the members down by age group for daily programming. In the Armory we will have several rooms to break the kids down to provide programming specific to their needs. The Armory is located within walking distance from the swimming pool, park, baseball field, and low income housing. The renovations needed includes heating and air, electrical, renovating the bathrooms, ceiling tile work, flooring for the gym, putting in a kitchen and also a security system.
