The Fairland Volunteer Fire Dept. has just completed a new station in the rural area. This station, along with our other two stations, will put most citizens within 5 miles of fire services and will also help reduce their insurance cost.

We will be putting an engine in that station and would like to purchase a new grass truck to place there also. We are looking at a one ton cab and chassis that we can put a bed and a skid unit on. Between Ford and Dodge we are looking at approximately \$42,000.00 to \$46,000.00 cost for the truck. A skid unit will be between \$10,000.00 to \$12,000.00. Having another grass truck in the county will allow us quicker response time to grass and timber fires and also give more resources for helping with surrounding towns and fire departments.

We are acquiring donations and membership fees that will be added to any grant money received to finish the needed funding.

Enclosed you will find the FY '19 REAP Application. The deadline for submitting completed REAP applications is October 4, 2018. REAP Funds will be contingent upon State Funding.

No applications will be accepted after 4:30 p.m. on October 4, 2018.

The FY '19 application is one page, but please note that three attachments (a resolution, a map of the project area, and a project budget) must be submitted.

Note: Eligible entities are governmental entities such as counties and municipalities. Rural fire districts, rural water and/or sewer districts, schools and other entities may also apply but must obtain sponsorship by the county or municipality in which they are located. Only one application may be submitted for each municipality.

Counties can submit an application for each district and may sponsor an unlimited number

of applications.

Police and fire departments that fall under the umbrella of a municipality must apply through the municipality.

If the application is for construction, the building and land for the planned construction must be owned by a municipality or county.

Projects that benefit over 7,000 citizens are not eligible for REAP funding.

Ineligible Projects during the 2019-2020 REAP cycle include but are not limited to consumable goods and office supplies, personnel costs, park projects, fairgrounds projects, mowers and lawn maintenance equipment, veteran's memorials, Capital Improvement Plans, Comprehensive Plans, Housing projects, and County Maintenance Barns for county commission districts with a population of more than 7000 or greater.

Requirements: Entities submitting a REAP application must have their GGEDA dues current as of September 2018, if dues are not current points based on requests will be deducted.
