Ottawa County, OK E-9-1-1 Address Request Form Why the need for A 9-1-1 Physical Address

A specific address is vital in assisting emergency services in responding to an emergency call to your home or business. In an illness or injury, a faster response time can make a significant difference in survival and degree of recovery; in a fire, it can determine the amount of property saved: and in a police incident, it can mean a totally different outcome. Calling 911 automatically gives the dispatchers the address, allowing them to send the appropriate police, fire, and medical personnel even if the caller is unable to communicate. Physical street addresses are also required for mail delivery and for other agencies such as utility companies, school districts, insurance companies, etc.

Ottawa County uses Enhanced 9-1-1 which is an emergency communication system that displays the caller's address, when calling from a landline phone, at a 9-1-1 emergency center or Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP). When you call 9-1-1 on your cell phone, your address does not show up like with a landline phone. Instead, Latitude/Longitude is provided. Use your 9-1-1 address or landmarks to describe your location.
